Minutes from July 28 PPERRIA meeting - (Dan Patenaude)

- 1) The 7/28/03 Prospect Park East River Road Improvement Association Inc. (PPERRIA) Board of Directors (BOD)/Membership/Neighborhood (B/M/N) Meeting was called to order by Steve Banks, President, at 7:10 P.M. at the Prospect Park United Methodist Church (PPUMC) (Orlin/Malcolm Avenues SE, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55414). A quorum of the BOD was present. Introduced were first time attendees, guests and visitors. Motion made, seconded and passed without noes: "To accept as the agenda for this meeting the agenda, as amended, available at this meeting." Amended were: A) As Item 2-B: Membership Report: B) as Item 3-B: Biotech Corridor information: As Announcement: Item 7-D: Neighbors for Peace. See attached Item 1. There were no additional items considered at this meeting.
- 2-A) Motion made, seconded and passed without noes: "That minutes from the 4/28/03 PPERRIA B/M/N meeting be accepted as published in the 7/03 PPERRIA Newsletter."

 Motion made, seconded and passed without noes: "That the minutes of the 6/23/03 PPERRIA B/M/N meeting be accepted as published in the 7/03 PPERRIA Newsletter."
- 3-A) Motion made by Joe Ring, seconded by Florence Littman and passed without noes: "That the Tower Hill Park Committee Mission Statement is the following: The Tower Hill Park Committee works to support endeavors that contribute to the preservation of the historic character of the neighborhood of Prospect Park. The appreciation of the historic significance of this neighborhood and its place in modern society." Joe Ring reviewed the motion. The committee has felt that there needs to be guidance in their activities and a use of their experience in the area of historic preservation and such activities as graffiti control. The committee would add a time dimension to various issues the neighborhood is working on. See attached Item 3-A.
- 3-B.) Motion made by Joe Ring and seconded by Karen Murdock: "That PPERRIA supports the proposal from St. Anthony Park Community Council and University United to have representatives of the city of Minneapolis explore with them the feasibility of Minneapolis and St. Paul to engage in an effort to create a Bioscience Tech Corridor between the two cities. PPERRIA also requests that the Minneapolis mayor and councilmember participate in the Biotechnology Conference on 9/17/03 being held by University United. If it is found not to be possible or feasible for them to participate, we request a written response from the mayor and councilmember." Joe Ring reviewed the motion. The recent state legislature proposed that there be Industrial Incubators. University United and St. Anthony Park has taken the lead in proposing such an incubator in the University Avenue Corridor. It fits in with the activities of the PPERRIA LRT/Transportation/Land Use Committee. This seems a fit with the University of Minnesota concept of biotech development. It is also a step in ending the perceived rivalry between St. Paul and Minneapolis. See attached Item 3-B.
- 4) Motion made by Meredith Poppele and seconded by John Kari and passed without noes: "To release \$25,640 from the PPERRIA/NRP Action Plan Phase I, Education C.1 funds to Southeast Seniors. A Living at Home/block Nurse Program." Meredith Poppele, Chair of the Board of Directors of SE Seniors, spoke to the motion and several individuals at the meeting spoke of their experiences on this issue and their support of the program which helped to put a human face on this issue.
- 5) Motion made by Joe Ring and seconded by Florence Littman and passed without noes: "That PPERRIA supports the renewal of the 1966 Federal Department of Transportation Act Section 4(f) with no changes or amendments." Joe Ring spoke to the motion. The act requires builders to consider alternatives when roads encroach upon environmentally sensitive or historical significant **July 28 Minutes** (continued).

areas. An editorial supporting no changes to the act in the 7/4/03 Minneapolis Star Tribune includes Prospect Park as an area that benefited from the act. The recent extension of the I-94 sound wall to Luxton Park is another example of the acts benefit to the neighborhood. See attached items 5-A and 5-B.

- 6) Tom Kilton, PPERRIA Neighborhood Clean Up Coordinator, announced that there will be a clean up in mid September but that it will be different from previous years: it will be a morning-only event; stuff that can be included in the weekly trash and recycle pick up will not be picked up; and individuals will need to bring their hazardous wastes to a site in the neighborhood on the pick up date themselves. Watch for announcements and flyers. Circulated were sign-up sheets to help with the clean up. See attached Item 6.
- 7) Announcements: A) Watch for information for the National Night Out activities on your block, 8/5/03. B) Copies of a letter sent by the Police Department to those who have violated the city noise ordinance were available at this meeting. See attached Item 7-B. C) There will be a public hearing on 8/4/03 at 2 p.m. in 317 City Hall regarding the establishment of funding priorities for NRP Phase II. D.) Dick Kain announced that there was a Neighbors For Peace group and, if interested, contact those who have sign in their yards. E) The Pratt Boot sale is to be 9/20/03 in the Pratt parking lot.
- 8) Florence Littman, Zoning Committee chair, reviewed the activities of the committee: A) The Fraser School and the Allina Clinic, Bedford and University Avenues SE, are working on a shared parking arrangement that would meet the city's parking requirements for each. The existing fence between the facilities and the neighbors on Fourth Street SE will be extended. B) Even though there is the start of a much delayed construction on the landscaping of the Great Brake's site, 30th and University Avenues SE, it looks as if it is not what was required by the city and what the owner agreed to do. The saga continues. C) On Fourth Street, there is a proposed removal of a house and the construction of a multi-unit. The committee opposes this. D) The owners of the fraternity houses along University Avenue SE in the University of Minnesota campus, oppose the historic designation of the houses and have plans to replace the houses with increased density housing. Committee members will be attending the city hearings. E) The committee will be reviewing the required, proposed, and actual parking facilities at the Jefferson Commons housing units (27th Avenue SE and west of the railroad track).
- 9) Joyce Barta, PPERRIA/NRP Coordinator, referred all to the PPERRIA/NRP Contractor Activities article published in the 7/03 PPERRIA Newsletter. \$804 was billed for 6/6/03 to 7/11/03 for committee support, history book activities and work on block clubs. See attached Item 9.
- 10/11) There was no old/new business brought up at this meeting.
- 12) Motion made, seconded and passed without noes: "That this meeting be adjourned." There was no additional business conducted at this meeting.
