PPERRIA Membership and Board of Directors Annual Meeting Monday, July , 2006, 7:15 p.m. PPUMC

- 1. President Joe Ring called the meeting of the Association to order at 7:15 p.m.
- 2. Neal Simons made a motion to assign time to the New and Old Business agenda items. Passed.
- 3. A motion to approve the agenda was made by Dick Henderson. Passed.
- 4. **Minutes:** Neal Simon objected to approval of the June minutes because of errors, which he did not designate. Approval of the minutes was tabled until the next meeting.
- 5. **Announcements**: Jeff Jellinek again invited PPERRIA members to visit **Anytime Fitness**, a new facility located in the former Kemps building. The date of the Boot Sale at Pratt will be on September 16.
- 6. **Clean Up Date**: Gratia Reynolds moved that the date of the Neighborhood Cleanup be moved to September 30 so as not to conflict with the Boot Sale and the September 23 Jewish holiday. Passed.
- 7. **SKB Permit**: Rick O'Gara of SKB Environmental explained that a permit for SKB to handle municipal waste had been approved by the PCA and the City, and that trucks carrying general municipal waste would be entering the facility, dumping the waste, and that larger trucks would be removing the waste to landfills before the end of each day. No more trucks than were already allowed under SKB's prior permit will be coming and going from the facility. This change is the result of SKB losing the city contract to handle yard waste. O'Gara offered to provide tours of the facility to those interested.
- 8. **Granary Road:** Joe Ring announced that the St. Anthony Park Council will support the extension of Granary Road to Hwy 280, provided PPERRIA support it not connecting up with Pierce Butler Road in St. Paul. Julie Wallace moved that we support the St. Anthony Park position. Passed without noes. Florence Littman will write a letter of support.
- 9. **City Pages:** City Pages has sent a certificate declaring that Prospect Park is the nicest picnic spot in the City. Joe suggested that since Prospect Park has received a number of awards and honors that someplace to display them be established. A first step will be to gather the materials.
- 10. **Zoning Report:** Florence Littman reported that the Zoning Committee had met and toured the Clary Building with a realtor trying to sell the building. The committee felt that rehabilitation of the building would be difficult. SuperAmerica wishes to purchase the building to expand its gas station. PPERRIA has previously objected to the expansion of SuperAmerica. Rebuilding of the Citgo Station on University Avenue will be requested at the Planning Commission. The zoning committee has supported the owner's plans. There are plans for a 5 story condominium/retail development at University and Arthur Ave. SE. The Regal carwash property has been purchased by the developer of UFlats, under construction on University at 26th Ave. SE. Riverside Market still plans to go into the proposed project at University and Emerald. The project has been delayed by the developer. The Prospect Park Business Center is looking for a daycare center tenant and a bakery. Florence reported that a young man wanted to satisfy his Restorative Justice obligation by playing his violin. There was no support for the suggestion.
- 11. **University Stadium Report:** Florence Littman reported that the Stadium Advisory Group subcommittee responsible for preparing the report to the Legislature on the impact of the University on the surrounding

neighborhoods had no chair, was operating on a consensus basis. Weekly construction reports will be available online. Dick Poppele volunteered to be a 2^{nd} alternate to the committee.

12. Tom Davey made a motion to adjourn. Passed without noes.
